*Wednesday, September 13 at 7:00 p.m.*

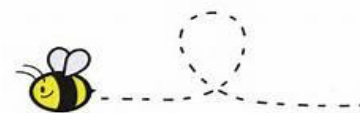

There have been many screen versions of Bram Stoker's classic tale of *Dracula*, but none more famous or enduring than Universal Studios' 1931 original. Because its initial release coincided with the transition from silent pictures to "talkies," when limited sound technology existed, no musical score was ever composed and there were few sound effects. For its 1998 restoration of the film, Universal commissioned legendary composer Philip Glass to write a hypnotic new instrumental score, blowing the cobwebs off the horror classic and adding depth to the emotional layers of the drama.

### ***Candide***

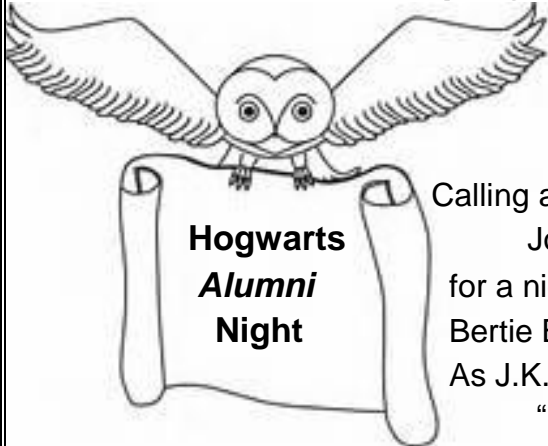
*Wednesday, November 29 at 7:00 p.m.*

September 25<sup>th</sup> - Mysteries set in Italy

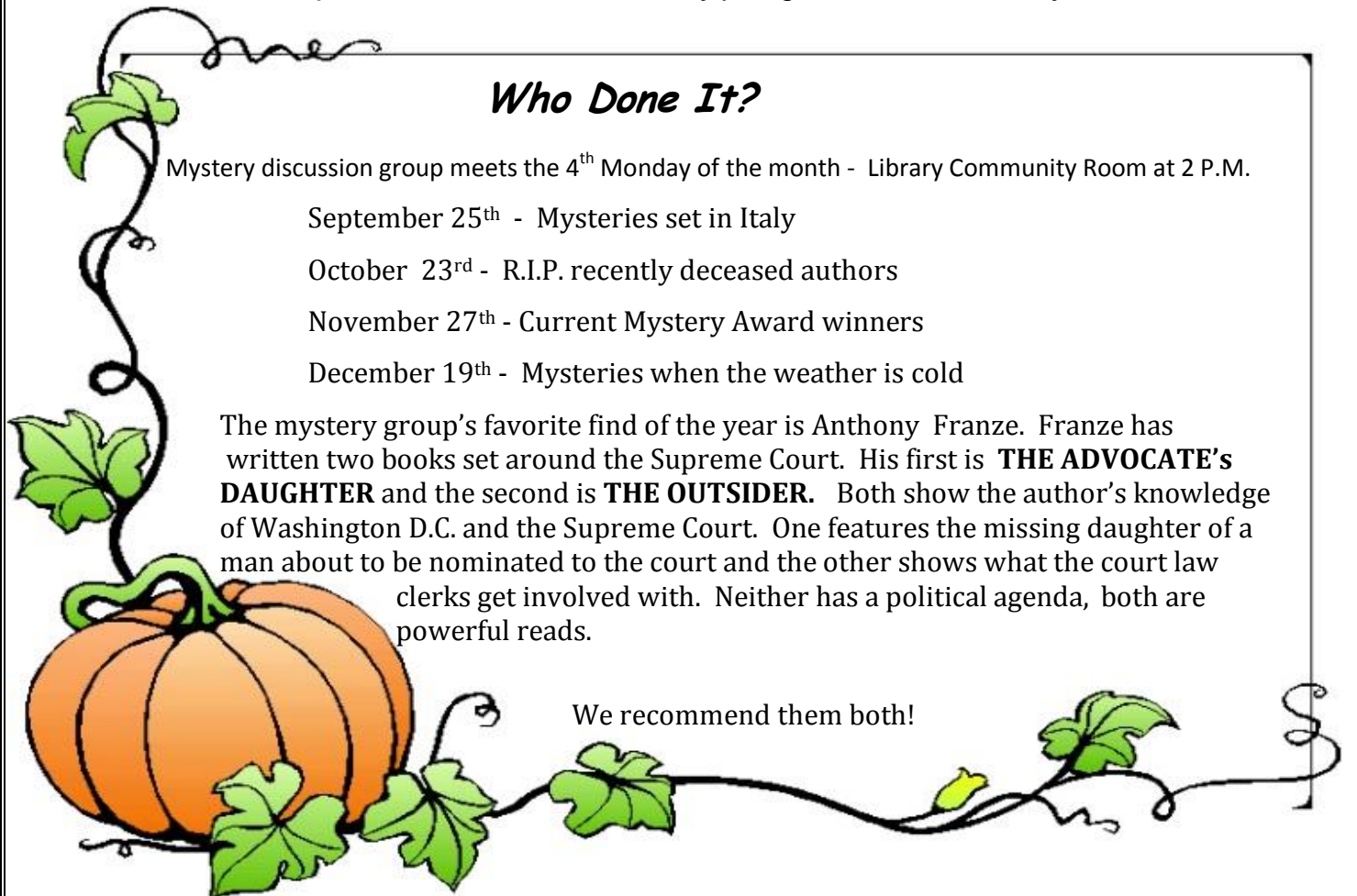
October 23<sup>rd</sup> - R.I.P. recently deceased authors

## Update on the New Library

On Wednesday, July 26, the Planning Commission held a public hearing to consider the new Yorba Linda Public Library and Arts Center project. By a vote of 4-0, the Planning Commission approved a Conditional Use Permit and Design Review, approving the project's land use entitlements. This project was also discussed at Tuesday's City Council Meeting, where the project's architect also shared the renderings of the new Library and Arts Center. The next phase of the project includes Design Development, where plan arrangements, specific space accommodations, equipment and furnishings, materials, and complete definitions of all systems serving the project are developed. Ground breaking for this project is expected to occur next fall, with the new Library and Arts Center expected to open in early 2020.
