The 2019 "It's Showtime @ the Library" Summer Reading Program (SRP) includes fun activities, crafts, performances, prizes, and much more for children, teens, and adults—all thanks to our amazing Friends of the Yorba Linda Public Library. Help us kick off a summer of reading with the SRP Festival on Saturday, June 15th starting at 10:00 a.m. This is the Library's largest single day event of the year with approximately 3,000 people in attendance, and we couldn't host such a large event without the financial support of the Friends! Some of the family activities during the day will include face painting, game booths, balloon art, a rock climbing wall, and crafts.

Kids aren't the only ones that get to have fun this summer. Adults will have plenty of events to choose from including musical performances, a DIY night, watercolor instruction and so much more! Kick off the summer with a glittering and feel-good medley of music and showtime entertainment on Saturday, June 22nd at 2:00 p.m. with Showtime Cabaret! Enjoy highlights from the classics including Frank Sinatra, Singin' in the Rain, and Chicago. Then on Wednesday, June 26 at 7:00 p.m., enjoy some Movie Magic as Cal State Fullerton Professor Matthew Thomas discusses the history of film scores. George Burns will come alive at the library on Wednesday, July 10 at 7:00 p.m. with a performance by Broadway and film actor Duffy Hudson. This one-man musical comedy performance will entertain with song, dance, and stories from the life of George Burns. Wrap up the summer on Saturday, August 17 at 2:00 p.m. with a sassier version of the Andrews Sisters. The Beverly Belles will entertain guests with the enchanting harmonies of music from the 30s, 40s, and 50s.

This year's reading program will also offer adults the opportunity to win some great prizes including an iPad mini, "Around the Town Baskets," golf basket, and so much more! Prizes and programs for adults are made possible by the Friends of the Library. Summer Reading Facts


- The benefits of summer reading are clear. National research from Dominican University finds that students who participate in public library summer reading programs scored higher on reading achievement tests at the beginning of the next school year than those who did not participate.
- Parents of children enrolled in the public library summer reading program reported that their children spent more time reading over the summer, read more books, were well prepared for school in the fall, and read more confidently.
- Young people experience learning losses when they don't engage in educational activities during the summer. Research spanning 100 years shows that students typically score lower on standardized tests at the end of summer vacation than they do on the same tests at the beginning of the summer. Libraries are part of the solution.
- To succeed in school and life, children and young adults need ongoing opportunities to learn and practice essential skills. Summer Reading Club reminds kids that reading is for fun—as well as for learning.
- There's so much to see, so much to do at your library! There's no better place to take your kids. The library is a place to learn, read, and have fun...a place the whole family can enjoy. In fact, more than 82 million children attend library programs every year.
- Studies show that children who are read to in the home and who use the library perform better in school and are more likely to continue to use the library as a source of lifetime learning.
- The amount of time children spend reading outside of school is linked to gains in reading achievement. Numerous studies show that access to books and magazines is directly related to higher reading achievement.

New Homebound Reader Services

The Homebound Reader Service is a free program specifically designed for those who are confined to their homes by an illness, disability or an injury, either temporary or long term. You must be homebound and live in the City of Yorba Linda in order to qualify for this service. The Yorba Linda Public Library offers a diverse and wide selection of books and other materials in different formats.

A professional librarian selects materials based on your reading interests or you may place holds on the items using our online catalog. Your selections are mailed to your place of residence on a regular schedule. The library also provides prepaid return postage to return the materials. You are eligible if you: live in the City of Yorba Linda, are temporarily or permanently homebound, lack transportation or are unable to physically visit the Library.
